We are sorry we have had to reassess our decision not to wear masks in church but this was in response to this email from Bishop Dagmar received last Saturday evening -

As the school year begins, the latest update from the C of E tells us:
"The national situation is presently moving from an epidemic state with current variants of coronavirus reaching new individuals to an endemic one where the virus is present in the community but where previous infections and the national vaccination programme means the majority of people have some immunity. Levels of immunity do vary individually and for some people they will continue to be significantly vulnerable to the virus and its potential long-term effects."

With significant vulnerability of some, the probable slight waning of the effect of vaccination for those vaccinated early on, ie especially the elderly, and the expected significant rise in infections as schools start up, I would advise you to encourage your congregations to rejoice in having services in person while also exercising caution.
